Road closures

The roading team advises the following roads will be closed:

River Road

River Road, between Diamond Peak Road and Heaps Road, will be closed to through traffic from **Monday 17 September until Friday 21 September**. The closure is to allow repairs to a bridge.

Kennedy Road

Kennedy Road will be closed to through traffic from **Monday 24 September to Thursday 20 December** to allow for the construction of a new bridge. There will be a temporary bridge bypass for light traffic only.

Dog registration reminder

Dog gone it – have you forgotten to register your dog? You have until **Friday 21 September** to get it done and avoid a \$300 fine.

No spray register

The Council will start its spring weed spraying work next month in Gore and Mataura. If you don't want your property frontage sprayed with herbicide, you can go on our No Spray Register. Just go to www.goredc.govt.nz and click on the link under Hot Topics. You will need to fill in the form and send it to us by **Friday 28 September**. Please be aware that property owners are required to maintain the areas they have requested be placed on the register.

Hamilton Park road closed

The Hamilton Park access road will be closed on **Sunday September 23 and Friday 5 October** to allow KiwiRail to repair the railway crossing. The public can still access the park on foot but are advised not to park vehicles on the Railway Esplanade reserve. Vehicles left on the reserve may be towed or the vehicle owner may be charged for any damage to the reserve.
