## 2. LAND TRANSPORT AT A GLANCE – GORE DISTRICT

Attached is a copy of the “Land Transport at a Glance – Gore District 2007” publication received from Land Transport NZ.

The information contained in this publication is likely to be of interest to Councillors and the public. A comparison between the Gore District and the national situation is provided in the document. This clearly shows that the roads in the Gore District continue to perform well both in terms of quality and cost when compared to the rest of the country using independent measurement of standard performance indicators.

### 3. LAND TRANSPORT NZ PROCEDURAL AUDIT

Attached is a copy of the audit report from Land Transport New Zealand (LTNZ) concerning the performance of the Council's roading activities. The report covers four financial years from the start of 2004 to the end of 2007. The comprehensive audit was undertaken during September 2007.

It is very pleasing to note that the audit confirms that the roading practices carried out by the Gore District Council during the period audited fully complied with the LTNZ requirements with the exception of three minor issues, all of which have since been addressed.

Hopefully the findings of this independent audit will help dispel some of the myths which have been promulgated about the Council's roading activities during recent years.
