No Spray Register



The Council will start its spring weed spraying in September in Gore and Mataura.

If you don't want the street frontage of your property sprayed with herbicide, you can have the area put on our No Spray Register. To do so, download an application form from the Council's website (goredc.govt.nz, link under Hot Topics), fill it in and return by Friday 13 August.

It's important to remember, property owners need to look after the areas they have asked to be included on the register.
